**STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION:** *In today's Gospel, Jesus has come "from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptized by him." It's something John never expected or foresaw. He didn't plan on this. "I need to be baptized by you," he says to Jesus, "and do you come to me."* Everything about this moment is contrary to what John believes, wants, and expects. And we've all be there. We know what that's like. What do we do when our prayers are not answered, our expectations are not met, our plans are disrupted? Today's gospel sets before us two choices. We can either resist, forbid, and try to prevent what is coming to us, which is what John wants to do. Or we can consent and "let it be," which is what Jesus tells John to do. Consent doesn't mean passively accepting whatever happens. It means actively giving ourselves to the circumstances, relationships, and people before us. It's an act of risk and vulnerability. And it's a profession of faith, hope, and love. It means staying open and remaining receptive to whatever in that moment is being asked of us in the name of God. Consent is an act of solidarity, a standing with another.
